## OCR: Legislative Authority

## Senate Bill (S.B.) 867, 80th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2007

- Amended Code of Criminal Procedure, Chapter 46B permitting outpatient treatment.
- Department of State Health Services funded \$4 million to pilot four programs:
  - ► Integral Care (Austin)
  - ▶ Center for Health Care Services (San Antonio)
  - ► MHMR Tarrant County (Fort Worth)
  - ▶ Value Options-NorthSTAR (Dallas)-now North Texas Behavioral Health Authority



### **OCR: Rules**

### Outpatient Competency Restoration External Stakeholder Rules Workgroup

- Purpose: To develop standards governing how OCR services are provided.
- Workgroup members:
  - Judges
  - Defense and prosecuting attorneys
  - Outpatient and inpatient providers
  - Policy groups
  - Advocacy groups
  - ▶ HHSC staff
- Met six times between July 2018 and August 2019.

## Draft 26 Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 307, Subchapter D

- Eligibility and ineligibility criteria for admission
- Recommendation regarding OCR program admission
- General service requirements
- Assessment, reassessment, and court reporting
- Preparation for discharge
- Outcomes
- Written policies and procedures
- Staff member training
- Rights
- Compliance with statutes and rules



## JBCR: Legislative Authority

S.B. 1475, 83rd Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2013

 Authorized HHSC to implement a JBCR pilot program in one or two counties that chose to participate.

S.B. 1326, 85th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2017

 Allows a county or counties to implement a JBCR program and requires HHSC to adopt rules as necessary to govern development and implementation.



## JBCR: Legislative Authority

## S.B. 292, 85th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2017

- Authorized the Mental Health Grant Program for Justice-Involved Individuals.
- HHSC awarded \$1.9 million to four JBCR programs.
  - ▶ North Texas Behavioral Health Authority (Dallas)
  - StarCare Specialty Health System (Lubbock)
  - ▶ Tarrant County MHMR (Tarrant)
  - ▶ PermiaCare (Midland)
- JBCR rules adopted August 2018.







- Court determines duration and place of commitment pursuant to art. 46B.071, 46B.072 or 46B.073
  - Outpatient
  - Jail-based
  - State Hospital
- 2017 Amendments to CCP 46B
  - promote local restoration

HPI: Pt is housed on 71A. Available labs, vitals, and other diagnostics reviewed. Pt was seen sleeping upon my arrival. Pt reports she has been medication compliant and they are helpful. Pt denies having psych symptoms at this time and states she does not need meds. She is however agreeable to continue taking Cogentin and Haldol as prescribed. Pt denies problems with mood, sleep, or anxiety. Pt denies SI/HI/AVH and states she is ready to go home. Overall, Pt is calm and cooperative with treatment. Due to the ongoing medical and psychiatric conditions of the patient, we believe that the patient's mental health condition  Has improved  Has not improved.

My observations:
Pt is ordered to the JBCR program. Evaluated Pt this morning and he is paranoid and angry. He only wanted to know how his mother and sister are doping and when he can go home. Explained this information is not available and he became very agitated, started rambling and cussing nonsensically. Two inmates on this pod report that Pt often talks to himself in the cell and appears confused; not knowing he is in jail. Pt was prescribed Depakote and Prolixin at JPS in 2018.

Recommendation to court:
☐ The patient has shown improvement and we will continue with the current competency restoration services.
Sufficient progress towards restoration has not been made thus far. Pt appears to require more intensive mental health services that can be provided in a hospital setting. We respectfully recommend that the court consider a review of the case for the possibility of state hospital commitment for mental health treatment and further work competency restoration.

Dear Judge Cacciotti,

Pursuant to the Court's order, the above-referenced Defendant entered the Jail-Based Competency Restoration Program (JBCR). While in our program, the Defendant was diagnosed with a mental illness and/or substance use disorder and prescribed medication(s) as listed below. The Defendant was medication compliant.

#### Diagnosis

Bipolar affective disorder, currently manic, moderate

#### Medication(s):

#### (ZYPREXA) 10 MG tablet

After attempting to provide competency restoration services, mental health services and substance use disorder services, as necessary, for 60 days, it is our opinion that the Defendant has not attained competency to stand trial while in our program and requires further mental health and competency restoration services in a state mental health facility. This opinion is based on the following:

- The Defendant appears to not have improved in rational and factual understanding of the proceedings against him/her.
- The Defendant's lack of cooperation has been so extensive that educational programming has not been possible.

Accordingly, the Defendant is discharged from JBCR as of the date referenced above and we recommend that the Court consider transferring the Defendant to a state mental health facility for further treatment and services.
